Dear Self-Advocates, Families and Guardians, Workers and Agencies:

The community-led panel I appointed to lead the PDD Review has been hard at work and has set dates for public engagement starting this month.

I am pleased to tell you the panel's first public community conversation is on **October 23rd in St. Paul.**

The community conversations are like open houses. Participants can attend at any time and stay as long as they like, and rotate through discussion stations at their own pace. There will be specific times for self-advocates, families, workers and agencies to participate. There will also be times open to the general public. You can attend whichever you choose.
