Family Resource Networks

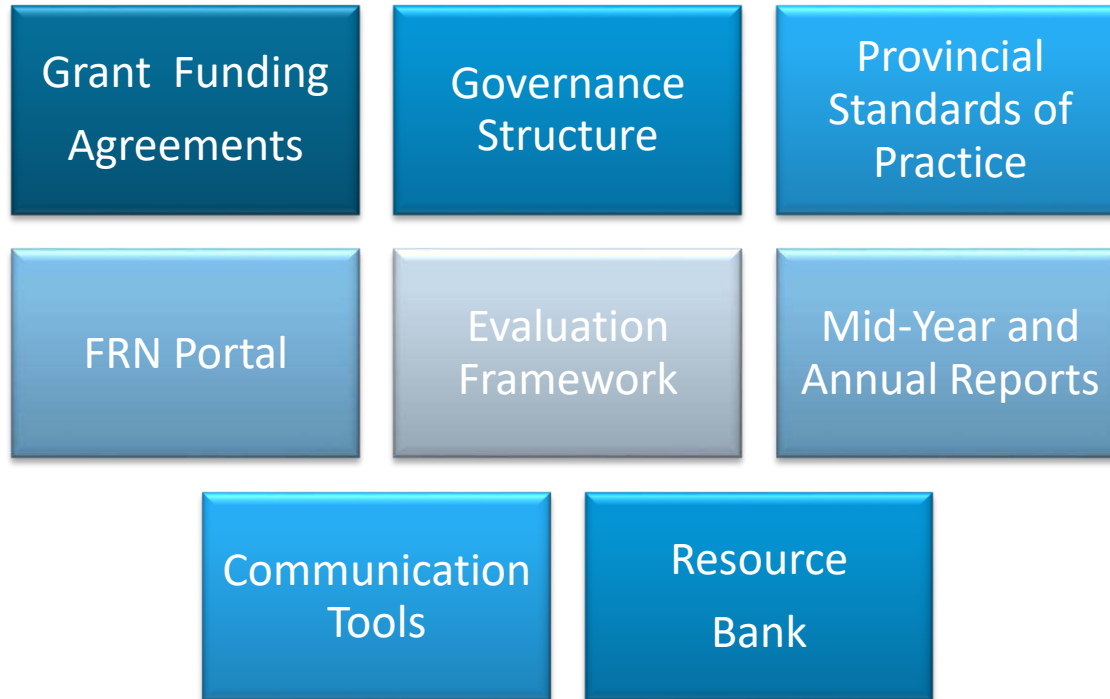


- 70 networks across Alberta supported by about 140 agencies
- Total annual investment of \$63 million

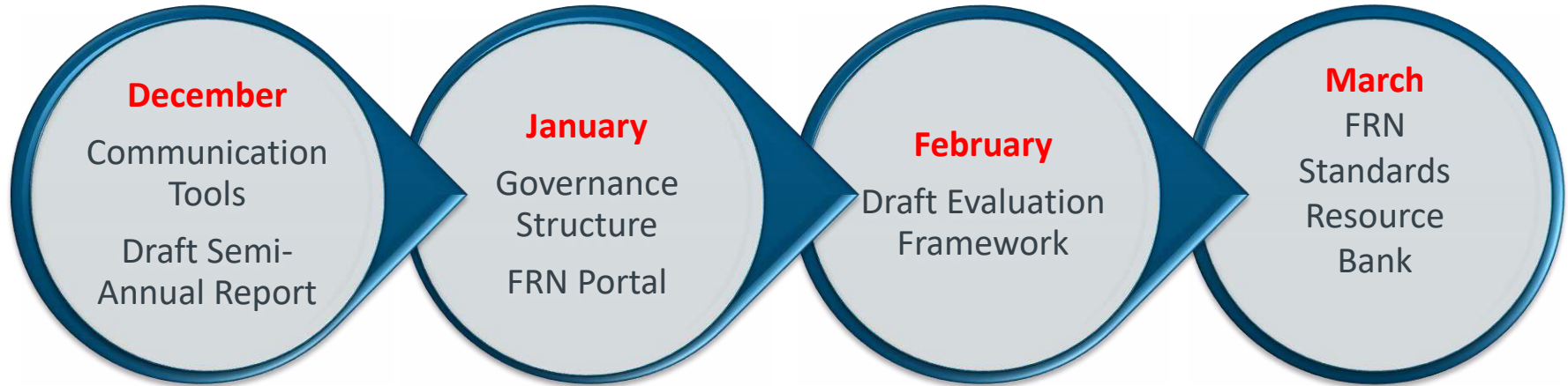
Objectives

- Establish an easily identified network of resources so families will know where to go to find the help they need.
- Connect service providers of all kinds through the network in a hub and spoke model, which will make it easier for Albertans to access services.
- Develop and delivery consistent prevention and early intervention programming.
- Consistent reporting and evaluation to understand impact of the FRN model impact.
