Details: This position is responsible for providing direct support to individuals diagnosed with developmental disabilities, mental health disorders and who are suspected to have FASD. Utilizing their skills and a variety of support services, they will strive to enhance the daily living skills of individuals to ensure quality of life, safety and structure. In this role, travel is required within the community of Fort McMurray.

This position is temporary until March 2022.

Hours: Monday to Friday 8:30am—4:30pm; 40 hours per week. A flexible schedule is required as some shifts may include evenings and weekends as well, depending on program needs.
