

Provincial Caregiver Training

Information for Caregivers

What's new?

- Effective January 10, 2022 PRIDE Pre-Service replaced Orientation for Caregiver Training (OCT) for new applicants.
- Caregiver Core Training is now called Caregiver In-Service Training.
- Caregiver In-Service Training consists of:
 - Instructor-led modules scheduled online, and
 - E-learning modules that you take on your own
- The Provincial Caregiver Training Team (PCTT) provides **all** provincial caregiver training

What's next?

- April 1, 2022
 - OLE, the learning management system (LMS) where you access Caregiver Training, will no longer be in use.
 - Caregiver Training will be accessed through the CourseMill LMS called PRIDE Online.
 - PRIDE Online is where you will be able to view and access all available In-service training from the course catalogue. This will include PRIDE e-learning modules, Alberta created e-learning modules and registration into instructor-led modules.

What do caregivers need to do?

- You will no longer have access to OLE after April 1, 2022. Ensure your Caregiver Program staff has copies of all of your training certificates/history.
- Ensure your support worker has an individual email address for each caregiver in the home. **This is required in order for you to have access to PRIDE Online.** The same email address cannot be used for multiple caregivers in a home.
- Review the new list of caregiver training modules.
- Complete the "Caregiver Training Inventory 2022" to determine the courses that you will need to take in the future. Provide a copy of this to your support worker.
- Pay close attention to instructions you receive via email from CourseMill and familiarize yourself with the Student Handbook and resources that will be provided to you.
