The Family Intervention and Safe Visitation Program Requires an: INTERVENTION WORKER for HINTON

Details: This position will be responsible for counseling families on an individual and group basis, where developmental disabilities, mental health disorders and complex behaviours exist. The Intervention Worker is responsible for overall case management, and the coordination of activities for the youth and families within the parameters of the program. Other responsibilities include counseling services and competency skill development for all members of the family as well as basic care and recreational services for the youth. They work effectively as a part of a team that collaborates with the family to assist them in achieving their goals.

The ideal candidate must have reliable transportation to allow for transport of children and adults for visitation and other purposes.

Hours: Total of 40 hours per week, flexibility is required as hours will include days, evenings and weekends.
