McMan's Family Intervention Program is seeking an experienced Family Preservation Worker. If you are knowledgeable about family dynamics, addiction, domestic violence, developmental disabilities, mental health disorders, and complex behaviors—and are passionate about making a difference—this role is for you. The successful candidate will provide families with the support, skills, and information needed to function successfully within their community. This position involves counseling families individually and in groups, managing cases, and coordinating activities for youth and families in alignment with program goals. Please note there may be pets in some of the homes.

Hours: 40 Hours per Week (Flexible schedule, includes occasional weekends and evenings as needed)
